Tug regulations Luleå

Note: This document is a translation of the Swedish version of the Tug regulations Luleå

In consideration of public order and security within the port area, the following have been established in consultation between the National Maritime Administration and the Port of Luleå to apply with effect from **01.01.2020**.

Special equipment is understood to mean

Functioning bow thrusters, stern thrusters or other special manoeuvring equipment that substantially improves the vessel's manoeuvring capability

Ordering of tugs

When a tug is required in accordance with the rules below, it must be ordered within 2 hours before the time of assistance. Call-off orders should be placed with the tug master on duty on +46 (0)7-6409607.

Regulations

N.B. See asterisk (*) at the bottom of the document for what requirements for tug type are referred to in the various cases

SVARTÖN (cruise ship quay)

Requirements for a tug or tugs are decided on a case-by-case basis depending on weather conditions and whether the vessels have functioning special equipment
